Project:

8 day devising process in which the director will be working with the performers to create the live show, utilising the "Is Dat U Yh" poetic film script as the stimuli. The show will include, theatre, direct address, physical theatre, improv, quick paced text, free-styling, movement/dance. With 2 performances at GDIF on Sep 11th and 2 performances at The Albany on Sep 19th

The role of the Costume Designer/stylist will be to contribute to the look of the cast, adding to the visual aesthetic of the piece through costume ready by the second week of devising w/c Mon 6th.

History:

After the many, many unprecedented changes COVID-19 presented us with, our LUDALA project (for stage) became the "LUDALA Collection" - 3 short films, made earlier this year that will be debuting at this year's digital Edinburgh Fringe Festival, supported by Eclipse and Summerhall (part of #EclipseAward 2020-21). AND NOW we will be having 8 days of devising and creating led/directed by Initiative.dkf bringing one of these short films to life through a LIVE outdoor theatre GDIF performance of "Is Dat U Yh?".

A costume designer able to research, source and style garments and clothing. You will be skilled with garment customisation, alterations and sewing; contributing to the piece through the wardrobe aesthetic

TASKS & RESPONSIBILITIES

Includes, but not limited to, the following:

- Work independently, and collaboratively as part of a team. (There will be flexibility for you to work independently outside of the room throughout negotiated days as needed.)
- Sourcing, designing and customising danceable costumes for all members of the cast, shown through annotated sketches. 5 costumes in total
- Sourcing and purchasing necessary materials and garments for all costume elements
- Creating a budget forecast and report showing spend/costing for all elements of full costumes that is within the materials budget
- Contributing to the overall aesthetic of the piece through costume design/styling
- Researching as required
- Liaising with Artistic Director to ensure costume is danceable and meets artistic vision
- Liaising with Stage Manager and Producers for logistics where necessary and/or requested

Requirements

- Must have experience styling and sourcing garments and materials frugally
- Proficiency with tailoring and sewing (by hand and/or via machine)
- It's vital you're organised, communicative and familiar with emailing and cloud storage i.e. Google drive
- You will have practical experience of costume supervising and garment customisation.
- An good understanding of Black British fashion culture from 90s to present day
- Ability to undertake further independent research.
- Sound judgment and discretion in dealing with confidential and sensitive data.

Preferably will be passionate about non-traditional theatre and interdisciplinary arts, with an objective eye and creative interests. Comfortable/open to theatre which considers all people and challenges stereotypes given the subject matter. Experience with outdoor theatre and/or film is desirable but not mandatory.
